the water source for the Reservoir comes from water that has been pumped from the City's inflatable dam on Mill Creek

The City's reservoir, which measures approximately 171 acres in surface area and extends to a depth of 40 feet, currently prohibits fishing and has a narrow access drive open to pedestrian traffic only, standard parking lot and a small boat ramp which is available for City use only.

The City's goal with the improvements is to enhance the Upground Reservoir facility to allow recreational amenities that will enable small motorized watercraft (not to exceed 10 horsepower) to boat on the reservoir and to permit public fishing.

The facility will be improved to include an additional parking lot for boat trailers, wider access drive, larger boat ramp and adjacent boarding dock. These enhancements will be geared towards improving access and maneuverability for vehicles with boat trailers.

Funding Information

The City of Marysville received **\$427,250** in funding from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) Division of Watercraft Cooperative Boating Facility Grant and the ODNR Division of Boater-Angler Fund for the Design and Construction of the Reservoir Improvements
